

OPTION A: CHARACTER PROJECT

Choose one character from the book(s) you read that you feel is a good example of someone who persevered despite obstacles. On the front of your project:-

1. Write the title and author of the book and the name of the character;
2. Draw an illustration of the character or make your character (puppet or paper mache)

In your project:-

1. Explain why the character is important and why he or she is a good example of someone who persevered;
2. Tell your feelings about the character;
3. Give examples of how he or she persevered - explain his or her goal, one obstacle that he or she faced, how he or she achieved a goal.

After you have completed your project, write a reflection on your project. Answer the following questions:

1. How does my project show what I have learned about perseverance from my book?
2. In what ways does my project include information from my book?
3. When someone views my project, what will they learn about my book?
